Dr. Filimão Chambo



We are honored to welcome Dr. Filimão M. Chambo as our General Superintendent in Jurisdiction for today's assembly.

Dr. Filimão (Fili) M. Chambo was elected to the office of general superintendent in the Church of the Nazarene in June 2017 by its 29th General Assembly, held in Indianapolis, Indiana, USA. He was director of the Africa Region at the time of his election, a post he had held since 2009. As regional director, Dr. Chambo was responsible for overseeing the church planting and development efforts of the Church of the Nazarene across the continent of Africa.

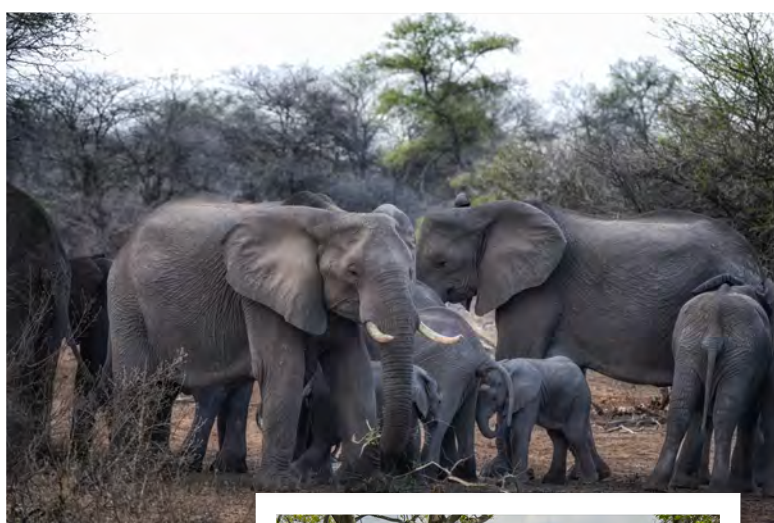
Born in Mozambique, Fili grew up in a pastor's home. Both his father and mother served in full-time ministry for the Church of the Nazarene. At the age of 17, when God called him to full-time ministry, his answer was yes.

Fili earned a Diploma in Theology at Seminário Nazareno em Mozambique (SNM) in 1993 and a Bachelor of Theology (ThB) at Nazarene Theological College (NTC) in 1997. He was ordained by Dr. Jim Diehl as an elder in the Church of the Nazarene in January 2000 on the Gauteng District, South Africa; and later that year attained his Masters of Arts (MA) in Biblical Studies from the University of Johannesburg. His Doctor of Literature and Philosophy in Biblical Studies (PhD) was also earned at the University of Johannesburg and was completed in 2009.

Before serving in the regional office, Fili's ministry experience included pastoral positions and Christian higher education. He served as pastor in South Africa for the Mphagane and Eldorado Park Churches of the Nazarene and in Mozambique at Igreja do Nazareno da Matola Cidade. He was an educator at NTC, South Africa, and at Seminário Nazareno em Mozambique where he later became president. In 2005 Dr. Chambo was named education coordinator for the Africa Region, where he served until his appointment as regional director in 2009.

Fili is married to Samantha, who is also an ordained elder, and they have two children, a daughter, Tsakani Gabriella, and a son, Emanuel.

Annual Report of the District Superintendent

West Virginia North District Church of the Nazarene

General Superintendent, Dr. Chambo, Mt. Vernon Nazarene University President, Dr. Castleman, President of Nazarene Bible College, Dr. John Bowling, West Virginia South DS, Bret Layton, pastors, associates, delegates, and friends of this forty-third district assembly of the West Virginia North District Church of the Nazarene, I greet you in the strong name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Grace and peace to you in the name of our risen Lord Jesus Christ. With deep gratitude to God and humble appreciation for the faithful service of our pastors, leaders, and congregations, I am honored to present this annual report to the West Virginia North District Assembly. What a year it has been! We have seen growth, new beginnings, increased ministry effectiveness, and the unmistakable hand of God guiding us every step of the way.

Spiritual and Numerical Growth

I want to begin this year's report by giving God glory for the encouraging signs of growth across our district. This year, we saw an increase in both morning worship attendance and Sunday School participation district-wide. Our churches have leaned into the mission of making Christlike disciples, and that intentional focus is bearing fruit. There is no greater joy than to know that lives are being transformed by the gospel and that more people are gathering to worship, learn, and serve together in the name of Jesus.

We also rejoice in the fact that we welcomed more new Nazarenes this year than last. These new members represent stories of grace, transformation, and new beginnings. They are the reason we do what we do—and we thank God for each soul added to His Church.

Stewardship and Financial Health

One of the remarkable marks of this past year has been the unprecedented increase in our district's total giving for all purposes. Through your generosity, sacrificial giving, and commitment to the Kingdom, our district has seen significant financial growth. Even amid economic challenges, our churches gave faithfully, and it is clear that God is multiplying these gifts for Kingdom impact.

In fact, all budget payment areas showed significant increases over last year. This faithful stewardship has strengthened our ability to support global missions, district operations, compassionate ministries, our regional college and even our pastoral pensions program. WVN met and exceeded our World Evangelism Fund goal, reaching 108.7% for Missions! In a year when twelve of our churches went through pastoral transition, this is a remarkable achievement of generosity. Thank you, pastors and church boards, for leading your congregations with vision and Godly stewardship. Your commitment to fiscal faithfulness has not gone unnoticed, and it is deeply appreciated.

Camps and New Ministry Initiatives

We continue to believe that camp ministry is one of the most effective ways to reach the next generation with the gospel. This year, all of our youth camps experienced significant increases in attendance. There is an unmistakable hunger among our youth for connection, purpose, and spiritual growth—and our camps are meeting that need with excellence.

Countless numbers of our students found Christ in His saving grace and many others have discovered a life of Holiness in sanctification. I've also had the joy of hearing testimonies of God's call to ministry from several of our youth and young adults this year. To God be the Glory.

We've just concluded another dynamic season of camp meeting where lives were changed, spirits were renewed, and new souls were brought in to the Family of God. We thank you for your faithful support of camp through participation and sacrificial giving.

In addition to our established camps, we're excited to have launched two new ministry weekends this year: a special needs camp, providing a loving and inclusive environment for campers with varying abilities, and a College and Career Retreat, offering connection and discipleship to young adults navigating the early years of adult life. Both events were well-received and are already being planned for next year with growing anticipation.

We also close the fiscal year at West Virginia Nazarene Camp with a word of praise: all of our bills are paid, and we carry no debt. This is no small feat, and it is a reflection of your generosity in our camp offerings, greater attendance in our youth and children's camps, and the hard work of our camp leadership, and the provision of our faithful God.

Church Planting and Compassionate Ministry

It was a joy to be a part of a very special moment in our district's history on June 29, 2025,—the official organization and signing of charter members for our newest Nazarene Church: Greater Vision Church in the Parkersburg area. At our last assembly we announced the vision for this new ministry. Under the capable leadership of Rev. Jeff Edman, this church has already begun making an impact in its community. We are excited to watch Greater Vision grow and reach people with the hope of Christ.

Another dream long in the making became a reality this year with the opening of Compassion Central—a transitional living facility for individuals coming out of addiction and rehabilitation. Rev. George Boyle has led this ministry with vision, humility, and passion. This year, Compassion Central welcomed its first four residents—a tangible reminder that God is still in the business of redemption and restoration.



Celebrating Local Church Achievement

This year, we also celebrate our Mountaineer Merit Award-winning church, which led the district with a 68% increase in morning worship attendance over the previous year. This incredible growth is a testimony to what God can do when a church commits to reaching its community with compassion, creativity, and conviction.

Equipping Our Pastors

Looking to the year ahead, we are eager to continue investing in our pastors and ministry leaders. Pastoral Development and Continued Education are critically important in a changing ministry environment. In addition to our ongoing events such as Ministers and Mates Retreat, Pastor's Camp, Team Days, and Exponential, we are excited to introduce a new opportunity for ongoing pastoral development.

It's a challenge to find Pastoral continued education for our leaders in rural and smaller communities. PALCON and M25 often fail to provide training for these vital mission areas. Through a partnership with Dirt Roads Network, our pastors will now be able to participate in a learning group designed specifically for ministry to our communities. A Representative from DRN will be with us later today and available throughout the conventions tomorrow to share more about how we can partner together to strengthen pastoral leadership across our district.

As we reflect on the year behind us and look ahead to the year to come, I want to pause and offer my heartfelt thanks to the many people who serve behind the scenes to make our district ministry possible:

To our District Advisory Board, thank you for your wisdom, steady counsel, and prayerful leadership. Your careful encouragement while developing new pastoral leaders is extremely important in an age when finding pastors can be difficult. We're praying for you as you mentor them through the process of ministry preparation.



To our Home Missions Strategy Team, thank you for your vision and tireless work in church planting and revitalization. By investing in new ministries, we're planting seed for the future of WVN. The direction we shared in our spring meeting will bring an amazing new day for our district team.

To our Department Heads, thank you for leading each of your ministries with excellence and creativity. Matt Croft has given our NYI a clear missional direction for leading our youth in finding their place of ministry in the church. John Witmer continues to fan the passionate flame of missions across the district. Our churches are truly missions minded. Stephen Zirkle is giving us a fresh perspective on discipleship ministries at a critical time in the cycle of resurgence. I look forward to hearing the reports of our departments tomorrow during our Mosaic Convention.

To our District Secretary, Andy Newman, thank you for your attention to detail and your faithful service. Much of what takes place today is due to our District Secretary's hard work and preparation. I'm grateful for his skilled planning for our Assembly as well as his oversight of records through the year.

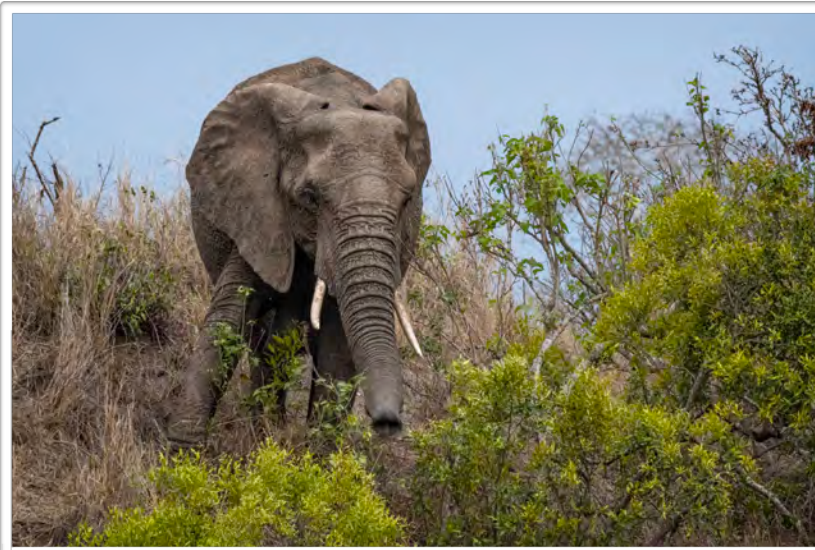

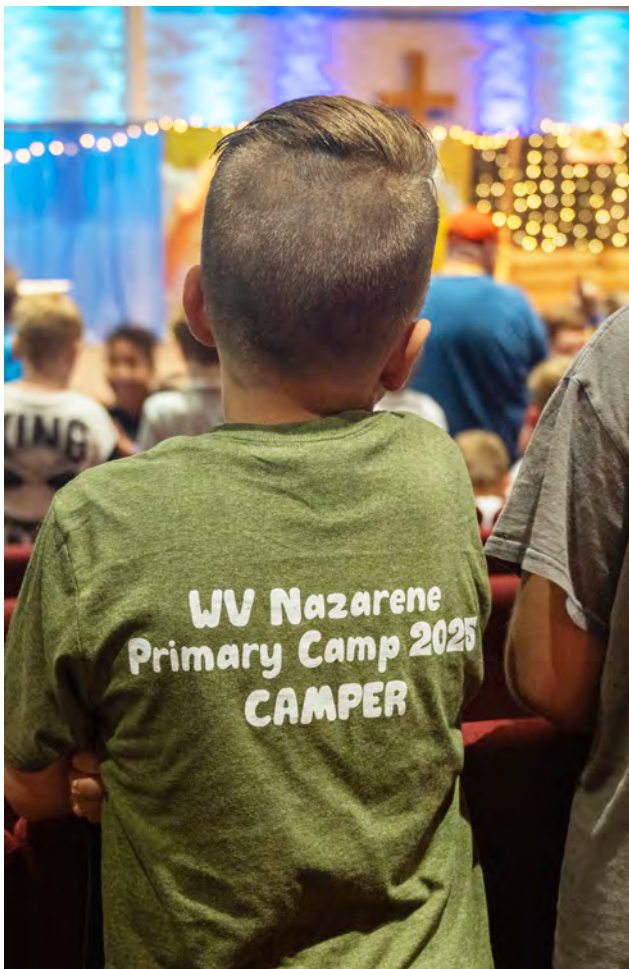

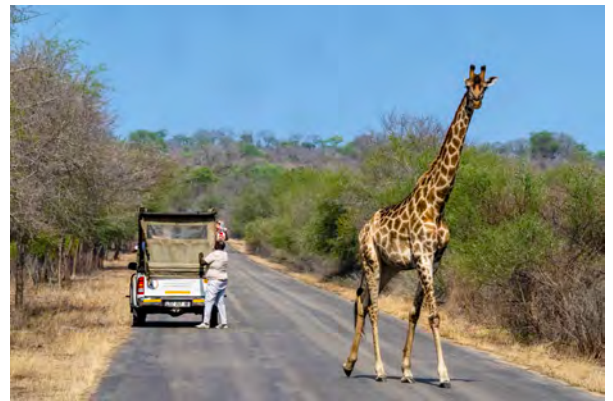

Dear District Superintendent Kevin Dennis and the West Virginia North District,

This is my first annual report to the West Virginia North District. As a newcomer to NDI leadership, there are 5 values NDI promotes as we seek to disciple others. The first (and foremost) value is **FERVENT PRAYER**. We as disciples seek to converse with God and be influenced by the Spirit. The second value is **COMPASSIONATE OUTREACH**. We have more to share with others. "For the word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword..." (Hebrews 4:12). The fourth value is **INTENTIONAL MENTORING AND EQUIPPING**. This value encourages us to be ambassadors or representatives to others with what we have learned from prayer, compassionate outreach, and Bible learning. Personal time and energy are required as we plant, water, and watch with a hope of ways God will use us in his plan for the harvest field. In mentorship and equipping, we provide words of encouragement and spiritual warning to guard those under our care against temptations and trials. The fifth value is **AUTHENTIC RELATIONSHIPS**. As we develop Christian character through the power of the Spirit, we make sincere attempts to express to others the activity of the Spirit in our lives. We are God's ambassadors, and we must be vigilant to remain spiritually authentic in all our relationships.

As we move forward into the next year on our district, it is my prayer that we develop these values and equip the local church with methods and ideas to strengthen discipleship. Jesus came to earth to reveal the loving heart of God and invite people to live in personal relationship with him. He came to die on the cross for the sins of humanity. He rose from the dead to validate everything he said and did in his earthly ministry. But he did not undertake this grand divine mission by himself. Jesus invited men and women to follow him, be discipled by him, and share him with the world when he returned to his Father.

Disciple-making is educating and training God's people for kingdom living through a directed course of Bible study and an incarnational demonstration of his truth in the context of an intentional relationship. Disciples were individuals committed to a particular person to learn that person's teaching or way of life and then to follow a particular pattern of life, whether by living in a certain way, passing on the teaching to others, or engaging in political or religious activities. Jesus' first disciples learned about life from the experience of hard work and discipline. They learned from success and failure. They learned from interacting in family relationships. They learned from the hard knocks of life. Jesus invited his first disciples to learn from him through on-the-job training.

He still invites disciples to learn from him in this manner today. He invites us to join him in God's mission to the world—partners with Jesus. This is not a generic call; the call is personal. Like the first disciples, we are sent out to "fish for people" (Matthew 4:19). I think that D.L. Moody summed it up well this way: "It is better to train ten people than to do the work of ten people. But it is harder." The truth is, disciple-making is hard, costly work and, generally speaking, we do not want to give ourselves to the process of disciple-making. The first disciples responded, "at once" (Matt. 4:20) and "immediately" (4: 22), without lingering contemplation, procrastination, second-guessing, or turning back. Jesus's call for a response from his disciples has not changed today. What he required of his first disciples; he requires of us as well. In the book, *A People of Grace*, author Sam Barber offers important definitions for "disciple" and "discipleship." Barber says, "A disciple responds to God's prevenient grace by accepting the offer of saving grace. A disciple becomes aware of and then accepts God's offer of sanctifying grace and grows in Christlikeness because of God's sustaining grace. Then a disciple takes up the mission of God to join with God in helping someone else along his or her journey of grace. A disciple is a person of grace. We call the process of growing in our relationship with God and inviting others along with us in the journey of grace discipleship." Jesus may not ask you to quit your job or forsake family responsibilities. However, he will ask you to realign your priorities in life to seek God's kingdom first and maintain a primary citizenship in heaven as you live and work for him on earth. Jesus says, "Follow Me", so that he can fashion you, chipping away everything that is not needed, to develop you into a "fisher of men."

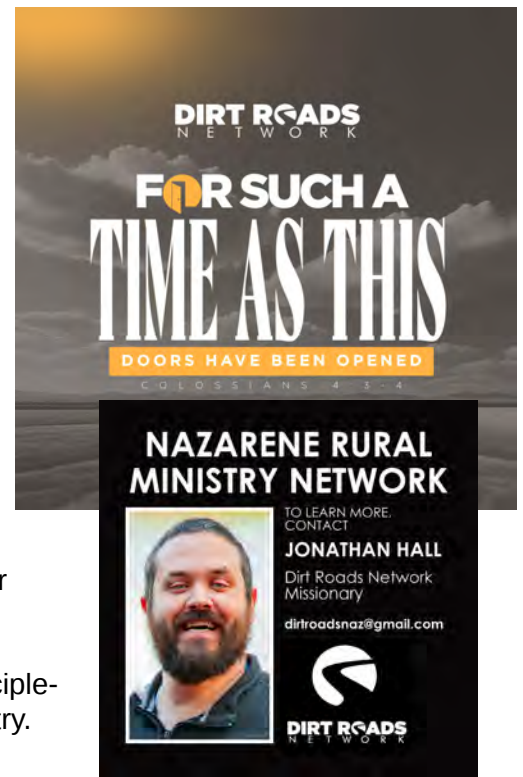
Pastoral Development Opportunity Dirt Roads Network

COMMITTEE

The stewardship of the local church is a very sacred responsibility that requires administration. As a part of denominational organization, the local church then must embrace the total program of the Church of the Nazarene.

Just as an individual is instructed by the Word to tithe his resources, so a local church should set aside a portion of its income to share with others.

Each pastor and church board should make adequate plans to underwrite their commitments to others in full. The underwriting of our commitment to others is further defined as the local church's giving to support the ministry of the worldwide church on a District and General level and to also support the efforts of MVNU to provide Christian educational opportunity for our constituency.

We recommend that 100% payment of ministry funds (budgets) be the goal of every church. To achieve this will require careful planning and constant monitoring of the church's financial resources. Therefore, we, your Committee on Finance, submit the following recommendations:

1. That in accordance with the General Church formula, the base for the calculation for all local church budgets be total money raised for all purposes less 10% giving (WEF, Alabaster, other defined 10% giving areas).
2. That we support the West Virginia Camp program and pay a budget of \$27,000 to help finance the Summersville Nazarene Camp program. That each local church and its members be encouraged to also support the Camp through love offerings or other means. (i.e. wills, annuities, trusts)
3. That, in keeping the mission "to make Christlike disciples in the nations" in the forefront, the district finance committee recommends a budget allocation formula for the 2025-2026 church year. The 16 percent formula is based on current-year income.

The formula includes the following:

District Unified Mission	6.0%
World Evangelism Fund (WEF)	5.5%
NBUSA (P&B) Fund	2.0%
Education	2.5%
Total ("Unified Fund")	16.0%

4. That each church shall establish a projected yearly budget in June or July, in accordance with the Manual, and a copy be sent to the district office before August 31.
5. That the District Unified Fund, World Evangelism Fund, College Fund, and Pensions and Benefits Fund be paid on a monthly basis, beginning on June 1, so that all funds may be in the hands of the proper treasurer by May 31 of the assembly year.
6. That all district and educational ministry funds be sent directly to the district office, West Virginia North District Church of the Nazarene, P.O. Box 2029, Fairmont, WV 26555-2029. That WEF, approved specials, and P&B ministry funds be sent directly to the Global Treasury Services, P.O. Box 843116, Kansas City, MO 64184-3116.

7. That the NewStart churches' District Unified Fund be assigned on the following formula, after organizational date:

First Full Year - 25 percent of the Unified Fund

Second Full Year - 50 percent of the Unified Fund

Third Full Year - 75 percent of the Unified Fund

Fourth Full Year - 100 percent of the Unified Fund

8. That we encourage the established churches to give prayerful support in finances and personnel to NewStart churches.

9. That we encourage personal solicitation in the areas of special gifts, wills, scholarships, and annuities. That we continue to invite representatives to the churches of our district for informative and inspirational services.

10. That we encourage churches with students at MVNU to participate in a scholarship program for their students in keeping with IRS standards and that each church research matching funds available from the employers of our people.

11. That the District Nominating Committee consider the pattern of fund payment of churches represented by nominees for district office and General Assembly delegates.

12. That the committee is opposed to counting any money as expenses on the annual report if not counted as income. This relates especially to day care operation, but also to rental property, and so on.

13. That all treasurers' books and all records of the church be open to the pastor and the District Superintendent at all times.

14. That in accounting for all moneys received and disbursed by the local church, the provisions of the Manual (counting of money and auditing of books) be observed. In no case should a person serve as treasurer of the local church who is not willing to conform to the requirements of the Manual.

15. That each church designate no fewer than two teams of money counters to be used on a rotating basis, where feasible.

16. That the following in terms of pastoral care be adopted by the local church:

a. The local church should comply with the Affordable Care Act (ACA) in regard to health insurance and medical expense reimbursement.

b. Each church reimburse its pastor at the end of each quarter for the amount of Social Security tax (15.3 percent).

c. The church board of each church review the pastor's salary and other benefits at least once a year, in conjunction with the preparation of the annual budget. Any merited increases in salary and other benefits liberalization should be considered, in addition to a cost-of-living increase (the national increase was 2.5 percent).

d. Each local church contribute to a tax-sheltered General Church annuity program (P&B Fund) to assist the Pastor with retirement living expenses and housing. In addition, matching contributions between Church and Pastor should be a consideration, when possible.

e. Each church should establish a vacation policy for the full-time staff, based on years of full-time ministry as follows: 5 years or less, two weeks (14 days, including 2 Sundays); 6-12 years, three weeks (21 days, including 3 Sundays); 13-20 years, four weeks (28 days including 4 Sundays); 21 years or more, five weeks (35 days, including 5 Sundays). The pulpit supply should be paid by the church.

f. It is recommended that local church boards give consideration to an optional vacation package upon request by pastors. This option would allow the pastor to forfeit one week of vacation and receive an

extra week's salary during one of the vacation weeks. For example, a pastor receiving four weeks vacation can forfeit only one week and thereby take remaining weeks as actual time off. For one of those weeks, the pastor will receive the regular weekly pay plus a matching check for payment of one weekly forfeited vacation. Reimbursement should include the full amount that would normally be received.

g. Each local church permit and encourage their pastor to attend one of the two Camp Work Weeks, one week at youth or children's camps in cooperation with our district program, and District Family Camp Meeting, and that it not be counted against the pastor's vacation time.

h. The local church give its pastor a Christmas gift of not less than one week's salary.

i. Each church should pay the expense of its pastor and spouse attending District Convention, District Assembly, District Camp Meeting, Ministers and Mates Retreat, Pastor's Retreat, District Women's Retreat, and traveling expenses to a Camp Work Week.

j. Each church regularly set aside adequate finances so that the expense of the pastor and spouse be paid for General Assembly and the Missional Conference (i.e. M15) and each local church provide expense reimbursement for its pastor attending PALCON.

k. Upon completion of every five years of service at the same church, we recommend that each minister, with the approval of the church board, and subject to the approval of the district superintendent, plan a sabbatical of no less than two weeks and no greater than eight weeks. The duration of the sabbatical will be established related to church size, financial capability, and pastoral need for renewal. The sabbatical period is not to be counted against the minister's annual vacation time. A sabbatical is a necessary time for planned spiritual, physical, and emotional rest that works to alleviate burnout and its symptoms. Planned sabbaticals renew both ministers and congregations and increase the length of tenures in ministry. Longer tenures, in turn, positively affect congregational health. Salary and benefits should continue during the sabbatical period. Churches should also consider reasonable expenses incurred in planning and taking the sabbatical.

l. Where possible, the local church pay the standard IRS mileage rate (and/or an alternative plan agreed upon by both pastor and church board in keeping with IRS guidelines) for travel expenses. This reimbursement should be seen as church expense and not as a personal expense of the pastor.

m. Since twenty lifelong learning hours (twenty hours of training) are required of our ministers each year, we recommend that financial consideration be given by our church boards, enabling pastors to attend accredited conferences.

n. Love offerings and other spontaneous expressions of love and appreciation for the parsonage family should occur regularly in the church. Remember that your pastor and spouse have been set aside by God for special service, and He is pleased by your attentiveness to their needs.

17. That full-time evangelists called by the local church should receive a minimum salary equal to twice the pastor's weekly salary including benefits, transportation, and prorated Social Security; these items should be covered separately and be so designated as recommended by Evangelism Ministries. Each church should remember the evangelists they have had during the year with an appropriate cash gift at Christmas time.

18. That the people be encouraged in the stewardship of possessions as related to wills, annuities, and life loans on behalf of the church, especially on behalf of missions and education. We further recommend that each pastor use every available means to continue an active bequest program through the local congregation. We recommend that each local church obtain guidance from Nazarene Planned Giving and / or The Church of the Nazarene Foundation Board.

19. That each church pay the expense of its delegates attending District Conventions and District Assembly.

20. That the District Advisory Board compute the delegate expense allowance for elected delegates to the General Conventions and General Assembly. When two members of a household are elected to attend a General Convention or General Assembly, each responsible department will pay a share of the amount set for delegates by the Advisory Board.

21. That reimbursement for mileage for all district job-related events be the standard charitable rate of IRS mileage.

22. That the District Fund will include a supplemental funding for the Annual Minister's Christmas Dinner, Ministers & Mates Retreat, Pastor's Camp, and the Certificate of Ministerial Preparation (CMP) Program.

23. That each local church must consult the MANUAL paragraph 169-169.8 before hiring ministerial staff. The MANUAL 211.13 and 139.27 requires the approval of the District Superintendent in writing. The District Superintendent will approve staff based upon, but not limited to, the following:

- a. That the local church adequately cares for its senior pastor.
- b. That all budgets be paid in full.
- c. That the local church maintain adequate financial strength to support ministerial staff. Based upon the prior year's "raised for all purposes" figure as a guide -

Under \$175,000 Raised for all purposes - no paid ministerial staff

\$175,000 to \$225,000 - One part-time ministerial staff member

\$225,000 to \$275,000 - One full-time ministerial staff member

\$275,000 and over - As needed

24. That the District Advisory Board / Board of Church Properties limit amounts to be borrowed by any local church to not exceed three times the amount raised based on an average of the last three years, and that this will include all indebtedness of the local church. The District Advisory Board / Church Properties Board will look closely at budget payments and advise accordingly.

25. That the district will provide financial support to any West Virginia North District Superintendent emeritus toward General Assembly expenses.

26. That any area of finance not covered by this report will become the responsibility of the District Advisory Board.

27. That this report should be read or distributed at the next regular local church board or finance committee meeting following the district assembly.

Over this year, Compassion Central has pressed deeply into its mission to bring the hope and freedom that comes through Christ to those impacted by addiction and poverty in Fairmont. Motivated by Christ's example to care for the least, the lost, and the hurting, our ministry is growing into a vibrant community of believers, volunteers, and partners committed to walking alongside those in recovery and crisis.

One of our greatest milestones this year was the completion and opening of our first men's recovery house. Thanks to volunteer work teams, over 1,000 hours were poured into transforming the space into a safe, welcoming home. In May, we proudly welcomed our first four residents, providing them not just shelter, but a Christ-centered, supportive environment to pursue recovery and long-term transformation.

In May, our 2nd Annual Community Outreach Block Party brought together over 300 neighbors for a day of connection, encouragement, and access to critical services. With 14 recovery partner organizations and church ministries in attendance, the event reminds us that recovery and renewal are imbedded in a community.

We also saw the successful launch of our Neighborhood Nurse Program, which began in January and has already provided free medical services to dozens of individuals who might otherwise go without care at this twice monthly free clinic.

So what's the plan for this next year? We are now actively working to: Open a women's recovery home, providing a faith-based space for women to heal and rebuild; Renovate a short-term crisis apartment to serve individuals in immediate need of temporary housing; Establish a free neighborhood laundry room, helping restore dignity and meet practical needs for our low-income neighbors.

We are beyond grateful that God has called us to this important work and pray for God's continued grace as we show our community that they are loved, important and wanted.

Dr. Chambo, Dr. Dennis, friends and members of the assembly: as a new start congregation blessed by our brothers and sisters, I am pleased to provide this initial report of Greater Vision Nazarene Church which began worship services on September 15, 2024. GVNC is borne out of concern for our neighbors - those "left behind" or that remain unreached with the Gospel. Thus, we focused on establishing a healthy Nazarene-Wesleyan faith community – preaching and practicing Scriptural Holiness, offering blended worship, expositional preaching, relational evangelism, and Biblical teaching (targeted to the 35+ age group and families – especially those that remain predominantly unchurched).
